The camp staff is at camp primarily to aid in the campers' program, not for their own social benefit. Staff need to acknowledge that by not adhering to camp standards they can jeopardize the camp's being licensed and the camp's effectiveness as a Christian environment.

Qualifications

- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Must have experience working in CBH kitchen or in another kitchen setting.
- Must have culinary training or in ServSafe environment.

Responsible to Camp Directors & Camp Dean

Responsibilities

- Prepare and serve all meals for campers and staff when scheduled
- See that the kitchen is kept clean so that it would pass inspection by camp licensing officials
- Make sure that the kitchen meets all state regulations
- Supervise kitchen volunteers
- Give camp director input on planned menus
- Keep a running list of kitchen supplies that are needed
- Follow safe handling rules for food preparation
- Take inventory of supplies before and after the camping week
- Prepare for various dietary needs of campers and staff

Expectations of all staff

- Attend staff training, even if you have been staff previously
- Reflect the camping philosophy of CBH in all activities
- Attend church on a regular basis
- A desire to know Jesus Christ better and God's plan for one's own life and the need to share that quest with others
- An appreciation for the natural world God has given us, and our stewardship of it
- Keep staff area neat and clean
- Have a commitment to Christ and ability to live as a Christian in daily contact with others
- Be aware that there must always be an adult staff member for every 10 campers
- Be available to counsel campers
- Create opportunities for campers to share in discussion of personal faith and Christian issues in today's world
- Be aware of limitations that some campers may have: emotional, reading, speaking out loud
